Early Mining in Georgia Gulch

Placer mining was done in Goodrich canyon in the 1870's and 1880's. The first mine in this area of the Tobacco Root range was a quartz mine discovered by a man named Jim Martin in the 1870's. It was called the High Ridge and was in Georgia Gulch. In the early 1880's, Andy Anderson also was prospecting for quartz, who came to the gulch and spent the rest of his life there prospect-



ing and mining. No other place was home to him, and his greatest pleasure was to dig and delve and dream of the hidden treasures of Goodrich Canyon. The Carolina mine was discovered by Andy Anderson about the year 1886 and was so named for the native state of his wife. He subsequently abandoned the claim as worthless. He later pointed it out to a friend, August Engstrom, who relocated and developed the mine, uncovering some very rich ore. Engstrom sold to Hoffman & Stotesbury in 1896 for \$5.500. The character of the ore in this mine was

Highridge Ore Bin known as free milling and was found in white quartz. Later, Andy Anderson discovered the Little Goldie, which was the richest gold mine at that time to be discovered in the Tobacco Root Range. For years he worked it himself in a small way. It paid him well up to the time he sold it to Mike Östronich for \$10,000. During the following years of development and operation, Ostronich realized a little fortune. The Crystal Lake Mining Company later owned the Little Goldie. To Andy Anderson belongs the credit of exploiting the possibilities of Goodrich Gulch. The surface has only been scratched and we must look to the future for the possible development of the vast deposits of gold, silver, lead and copper that lie within the several gulches. Also, in the 1880's, Sam VanMeter discovered a rich lead mine in the area and called it the Keynote. Another mine called the Corn Cracker was established by Noah Armstrong who also built a five-stamp mill in the 1880's. Some mining ores found were lead and silver or lead and gold; some of the products were assaying nearly 50 percent lead.

By 1901-02, August Urbane did placer mining there with no success. All the ore that was shipped from the mine in the early days, when it had to be carted to Whitehall, ran more than \$200 in gold per ton; the lower grade ore being left as the cost of shipment was so high that only the best ore could be shipped. The bulk of the ore was shipped to the Iron Rod mill and put through an arrastra and ran about \$180 gold per ton, with silver and lead in quantities to pay all costs. The ore was hauled from the mine by means of a "go-devil" trail and then ore boats whereby the ore was snubbed down the mountainside to the floor of the canvon about 500 feet lower. From there it would have been carted to the mill.

After the coming of the railroad the lower grade bodies of ore were turned too, and many shipments were made that averaged about \$65 per ton in gold. The Carolina mine had 1500 feet of tunnels and shafts and was owned by the Hoffman estate and Mrs. Fern H. Stotesbury. The state mine inspector, in his report of 1912, said: "Madison County ranks with the most favored of the mineral bearing sections of the state. The Virginia City and Twin Bridges districts are coming to the front and showing permanency so far as developed."

The war in Europe, which developed into World War I, began soon after this date and mining received a check from which it has not yet recovered. However, Rochester Gulch and the Tobacco Root Range are rich with valuable ores and our valley is surrounded with untold wealth awaiting future development.

To Andy Anderson belongs the credit of exploiting the possibilities of Goodrich Gulch. The surface has only been scratched and we must look to the future for the possible development of the vast deposits of gold, silver, lead and copper that lie within the several gulches.
