

Sacagawea, also spelled Sacajawea, (born c. 1788, near the Continental Divide at the present-day Idaho-Montana border, died December 20, 1812. (Fort Manuel, on the Missouri River, Dakota Territory), She was a Shoshone Indian woman who, as interpreter, traveled thousands of wilderness miles with the Lewis and Clark Expedition (1804–06), from the Mandan-Hidatsa villages in the Dakotas to the Pacific Northwest. In Hidatsa, Sacagawea (pronounced with

from the Mandan-Hidatsa villages in the Dakotas to the Pacific Northwest. In Hidatsa, Sacagawea (pronounced with a hard g) translates into "Bird Woman." Alternatively, Sacajawea means "Boat Launcher" in Shoshone. Others favor Sakakawea. The Lewis and Clark journals generally support the Hidatsa derivation.

A Lemhi Shoshone woman, she was about 12 years old when a Hidatsa raiding party captured her near the Missouri River's headwaters about 1800. Enslaved and taken to their Knife River earth-lodge villages near present-day Bismarck, North Dakota, she was purchased by French Canadian fur trader Toussaint Charbonneau and became one of his plural wives about 1804. They resided in one of the Hidatsa villages, Metaharta.

When explorers Meriwether Lewis and William Clark arrived at the Mandan-Hidatsa villages and built Fort Mandan to spend the winter of 1804–05, they hired Charbonneau as an interpreter to accompany them to the Pacific Ocean. Because he did not speak Sacagawea's language and because the expedition party needed to communicate with the

Because he did not speak Sacagawea's language and because the expedition party needed to communicate with the Shoshones to acquire horses to cross the mountains, the explorers agreed that the pregnant Sacagawea should also accompany them. On February 11, 1805, she gave birth to a son, Jean Baptiste.

Departing on April 7, the expedition ascended the Missouri. On May 14, Charbonneau nearly capsized the white pirogue (boat) in which Sacagawea was riding. Remaining calm, she retrieved important papers, instruments, books, medicine, and other indispensable valuables that otherwise would have been lost. She proved to be a significant asset in numerous ways: searching for edible plants, making moccasins and clothing, as well as allaying suspicions of wea with baby Pompey and Lewis's dog Seaman stands at approaching Indian tribes through her presence; a woman and child accompanying a party of men indicated peaceful intentions.

By August of 1805 they came up the Jefferson river and later ended up at a spot where the Big Hole and the Beaverhead came together. Several times it is found written in their journals as they remarked on the "circuitous rout" and the "meandering course" of the river they called Jefferson's. Lewis wrote, "in many places they were obliged to double man the canoes and drag them over the stone and gravel." There they would camp right at Twin Bridges. The party would then go above the junction point and found where the Ruby river flowed in, and after considering together they concluded that the Beaverhead was the principal stream, the "Main Missouri," and they continued to call that stream the main Missouri or Jefferson's Fork throughout their journal. The Ruby River was named the Philanthropy and the Big Hole River was named in their journals as Wisdom River. On 8 August 1805, near today's town of Twin Bridges, the men were tediously poling their canoes up the river they called Jefferson's, which was becoming ever more "crooked with Short bends a few Islands and many gravelly Sholes." That evening, Sacagawea shed the light of hope on the prospect of finally meeting her people, and securing horses for the portage over the mountains to the headwaters of the Columbia. As they camped in the vicinity of Twin Bridges they saw the Beaver's Head, one of the most remarkable landmarks of the area. The compass bearings Clark took on 13 August 1805, from a point on the river about 14 miles south unmistakably identify this landmark as the feature she said was Beaverhead Rock, Furthermore, a mountain man's journal of

1831 also placed the well-known landmark here, near the mouth of the Ruby River, as did Montana pioneer Granville Stuart in about 1865.
"The Indian woman," wrote Meriwether Lewis, "recognized the point of a high plain to our right which she informed us was not very distant from the summer retreat of her nation on a river beyond the mountains which runs to the west. This hill she says her nation calls the beaver's head from a conceived resemblance of its figure to the head of that animal.'

It is easily recognizable and can be seen for many miles from three different directions. It was a pole star for the native Americans in centuries past, as well as trappers, the voyagers, the prospectors and the settlers as they traveled into what is now known as Beaverhead and Madison Counties. Lewis and Clark described the location of the of the Beaver's Head with absolute accuracy in their writings with Sacagawea describing it as a land mark name called the "Beaver's Head." It has since become the Beaverhead Rock and the reason for the name of the county

Clark and the main party, with the eight dugout canoes, reached Beaverhead Rock on 10 August 1805, which Lewis had passed two days earlier. Meanwhile, Lewis covered 60 miles via a well-traveled Indian road, reaching the forks of Red Rock and Horse Prairie creeks, and camping five miles up the latter, headed toward Lemhi Pass.

It took 18 days for the main party to wrestle their canoes the 163 miles (by modern measurement) from the Three Forks of the Missouri to Camp Fortunate. No wonder the men "complain very much of the eminence labor they are obliged to undergo," as Clark wrote on 12 August 1805, "& wish much to leave the river." On the other hand, in July 1806, his 22-person contingent covered the same distance in the six remaining canoes, in just four days.
Today, it's only 110 highway miles from Missouri Headwaters State Park at the Three Forks, to Clark

Canyon Dam near the site of Camp Fortunate—an easy two-hour drive, and at highway speeds the

silhouette of the beaver's head that cheered the Corps of Discovery eludes most passers-by. After the centennial observances in St. Louis

formal commemoration of Sacagawea's role in the Lewis and Clark expedition was a historical pageant presented in 1915 at the place where it was believed the explorers stepped out of their canoes, the place they dubbed "Fortunate Camp." The pageant was written by Mrs. Laura Tolman Scott and sponsored by Montana Daughters of the

The monument shown here was erected in 1937 near the presumed site of Camp Fortunate. It was moved to higher ground in 1962 when construction of Clark Canyon Dam began. The text on the bronze plaque recalls the legend, which had emerged at the turn of the century, that Sacagawea's principal role was to guide the Lewis and Clark expedition through the West. The plaque reads: This site was the pivotal point in the success of the journey of the Lewis and Clark Expedition. The party camped here in August 1805. They cached their boats and aided by influences of Sacajawea obtained horses from her people the Shoshone Indians.

The Great American Epic of Lewis and Clark stands without parallel in the history of the opening of the west and the successful accomplishment was largely due to the guidance and loyalty of the Indian girl Sacaiawea.

Indian girl Sacajawea.
John C. Luttig, Lisa's clerk at Fort Manuel, kept a journal that included this entry for 20 December 1812: "This Evening the Wife of Charbonneau a Snake Squaw, died of a putrid fever she was a good and best Woman in the fort, aged about 25 years she left a fine infant girl."
The following year, Luttig was named guardian of Jean Baptiste and Lisette in a St. Louis court document. His name was later replaced with that of William Clark, who paid for the raising and education of the children in St Louis. When Clark wrote his list of the fates of expedition members sometime between 1825 and 1828, he noted Sacagawea as deceased.

Another story of Sacagawea's later years and death must be mentioned, the oral tradition of the

Another story of Sacagawea's later years and death must be mentioned, the oral tradition of the Eastern Shoshone people. (Sacagawea's people were western Shoshones who lived in the present Lemhi River valley, in Idaho.) The story handed down among the Wind River Shoshones is that Sacagawea adopted an Eastern Shoshone man named Bazil, as her son, and in her later years moved to live with him in Wyoming. There, according to Eastern Shoshone tradition, she is said to have died in 1884, at nearly 100 years of age, and was buried at Fort Washakie on the Wind River [Shoshone] Indian Reservation.
