

FRANK BIRD LINDERMAN

Frank Bird Linderman contributed to the foundation of the Ruby Valley in the early 1900's and went on to become a Native American advocate and ethnographer, politician, and Montana biographer. He was captivated with the life of the Montana frontier and was instrumental in forging a bond between white westerners and Native Americans here.

He was born in Cleveland, Ohio on September 25, 1869. Before coming to the Montana Territory in 1885, at the age of 16, he attended Oberlin College in Ohio. He was a trapper who became familiar with many members of the Salish (aka Flathead), Kootenai, Cree, Chippewa, and Blackfeet tribes. He set up camp on their territory on the shores of Flathead Lake, where he learned their ways and lived as they did. To know them better and communicate for trading, he mastered their sign language. Some tribes assigned him Native names. He was known by the Crow as "Great Sign-talker", Blackfeet called him "Iron Tooth", the Kootenai knew him as "Bird-Singer", and the Cree and Chippewa called him "Glasses" or "Sings-like-a-bird." He was intrigued with their cultures and began to chronicle Native American lives and legends.

In 1891 he met Minnie Jane Johns, in Demersville (now Kalispell). In order to marry her, he needed to earn more money, so he started working for the Curlew Mine in Ravalli County as a watchman, eventually becoming an assayer (metal tester). He and Minnie married in Missoula in 1893. The Curlew Mine closed that year and the Linderman's moved to Butte, where Frank was chief assayer and chemist for the Butte & Boston Smelter. Two of his daughters were born there. He complained that the city was brutal, "overrun with rough immigrants from Europe".

To escape from those conditions, the family moved to Brandon, a historical mining district just east of Sheridan in 1898. He built a cabin on Mill Creek and their third daughter was born.

Frank worked several jobs here. Initially he was an assayer and furniture salesman. Soon afterwards, he purchased the failed Sheridan newspaper for \$5 and began publishing "The Chinook". Linderman became active in politics and was elected in 1902 to the state Legislature as the representative from Madison County. He was elected again in 1904 and served as Assistant Secretary of State from 1905–07. He then became an insurance agent for The Guardian Insurance Company of America.

All the while, he continued to write about Native American culture, and he submitted his first publication in 1915.

"Indian Why Stories: Sparks from War Eagle's Lodge-Fire" was a compilation of folktales with such titles as: "Why the Chipmunk's Back is Striped", "How the Ducks got their Fine Feathers", "Old Man and the Fox", and "Why Blackfeet Never Kill Mice". After that, he began publishing numerous magazine articles, tales, anecdotes, and poems. Charles M. Russell, a close friend, illustrated many of his works.

He became a political advocate for Chippewa Chief Rocky Boy. Their tribe had been assigned to land that was infertile and unsuitable for farming. Linderman used his prominent white network, including other politicians and Charlie Russell, to help gain Congressional passage of legislation in 1916, which established the Rocky Boy Indian Reservation for landless Chippewa and Cree. He ran for the U.S. Congress the same year. Linderman saw the Native Americans as the *real* Americans, while believing there was a *place* for the Anglo-Americans in the West. He tirelessly pressed politicians and Indian service bureaucrats for better rations, permission for the Indians to practice traditional dances, such as the *forbidden* sun dance, and for an expansion of the Rocky Boy reservation.

In 1917, Linderman moved to Goose Bay on Flathead Lake and devoted himself to preserving the Old West, buffalo-era Indians of Montana, and natural resources in words and art. He became a talented sculpture artist and created several Native-influenced pieces. He and Charlie Russell worked to obtain a "homeland" and treaty rights for the Cree and Chippewa. Frank was adopted into the Blackfeet, Cree, and Crow tribes for his efforts. He ran for the U.S. Congress again in 1918. In 1924 he ran for the U.S. Senate against Thomas J. Walsh and was defeated by a wide margin. In the same year he bought the Hotel Kalispell, which he sold 2 years later for profit.

By the time of his death in 1938, he had authored 13 books and produced 17 bronze sculptures. Linderman's descendants continue to preserve his literary and anthropological legacy. Many of his works are available at Project Gutenberg (gutenberg.org) and the Internet Archive (archive.org) The Frank Bird Linderman House in Lake County, Montanais listed as a National Historic Place. His papers are preserved at the University of Montana in the "Frank B. Linderman Memorial Collection, 1885-2005". Other papers of Linderman are held by UCLA. In 2007, he was inducted into the Hall of Great Westerners of the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum.

Thanks to research work by Celeste River, the energetic leadership of Carol Lee and Dr. Warren Swager, and the hard work and generous gifts of several volunteers, the remains of Linderman's Mill Creek cabin was identified. The Virginia City Preservation Alliance obtained the deed to the cabin, and it was relocated to property adjacent to Robber's Roost. The cabin has been beautifully restored. Linderman's granddaughter, Sally Hatfield, attended the dedication ceremonies in 2011. Today the cabin not only serves as a memorial to Frank Bird Linderman, but also provides a wonderful site for meetings...and as a peaceful spot to enjoy the natural beauty of the area...and a perfect place to sit and read one of Linderman's books.






