



Supper Extra. Benefit Alder Fire Dept DANCE SOCIALS OF THE OLD WEST

The folk culture of dancing in the Old West closely paralleled those in Europe, letting pioneers pattern their new dances from the old. In America's Old West, dance became a social activity of utmost interest and importance. Pioneer dances were planned to help ease the times of impoverished life of hard, unending toil and allowed an unrestrained mixing of all levels of society plus the possibility of aspiring to higher economic and social status. Dancing was a convenient form of recreation and social interaction not available by other, more expensive, and less accessible, means. It was fun, it was free (or cheap), it brought opposite genders together in an acceptable venue, and it provided both physical and artistic expression. So, dance they did, lowly cowboys rubbing elbows with cattle barons, lawmen, and horse thieves, proper ladies, and soiled doves alike.

In Montana, early Native American's tribal dances were a form of communication with unseen spirits, a form of prayer, and a psychological preparation for war or hunting. In 1921, a suggested dance ordinance was put forth for local dance halls in the State of Montana. It decreed that it would be unlawful to conduct dances and permit minors under the age of 18 years to enter or remain in the dances unless accompanied by their parents or guardian. It also suggested that certain dances be forbidden such as: "hootchee-kootchee," 'bunny hue berk" "turkey trot," "skinny dance" "camel walk," and any other suggestive or immoral dances. The penalty for violating the ordinance was, upon conviction, not less than \$5 nor

more than \$25, for each offense. They also wanted each dancing institution to provide a matron and police officer to supervise over the dancing steps and remove any intoxicated persons, those dancing immorally, or found to be offending the dance ordinance from the dance halls. Officers and matrons were to be paid salaries by the parties conducting the dance halls. Adequate illumination about the place of business was another provision because if lights were "dimmed" or turned low while dancing was in progress, it was commonly known as "moonlight" dances, which was a big no-no.

In our local Ruby Valley area, names for local dancing events were very creativ, such as Handkerchief Ball held in Twin Bridges in the early 1900's. The dancers would wave handkerchiefs above their heads to symbolize feathers, and/or the rooster's comb. It was a dance to gather everyone to raise money for a local charity, showcase the best food, the fanciest dance attire, and a chance to be the most creative promoter in the area.

#### PICKTHALL BECOMES **MASTER CEREMONIES**

Billy Pickthall, the Miners' own ightfooted maestro of the dance, has lately been acting as master of ceremonies at the Saturday night dances held at Twin Bridges every other week.

These dances have been featured by a fox-trot contest with a prize of ten dollars (\$10) each night, to be divided among the four winning ouples. The winners last Saturday, April 22nd, were Helen Leary, 106 Mullan, Butte: William Mulcahy, 748 N. Wyoming, Butte: Esther Leary, 106 Mullan, Butte; Ed Sheehan, 836 N. Wyoming, Butte; Helen Lahey, Virginia City; Jim Armitage, Ennis, and Mrs. Byron Glennan and Myron Herman, both of Twin Bridges,

Two more heats will be run offbeg pardon, danced off-Saturday, May 6th and May 20th. Each night the four winning couples will divide a ten dollar prize between them and in the finals, to be held June 3rd, a grand prize of fifty dollars (\$50) will e given to the winning couple.

Billy invites all interested persons to attend these dances at Twin Bridges and especially miners and their wives and families.

In the 1950's, Sheridan blocked off Main Street in celebration of the May Strawberry Festival. This entailed the auctioning of homemade strawberry cakes and pies and later festive music would encourage dancing through the night. Around the same time, square dancing became very popular all around Montana. The Twin Bridges Square Dance Club held its first event at the Blue Anchor dance

hall to showcase their hard-earned skills.

In the summer months, I can remember when Alder and Laurin would throw big street dances. Loud country music would encourage dancers to fill the streets, which would create and air of celebration. I also remember when the Madison County Fair in Twin Bridges would help bring a festive feeling that helped create nightly street dances. The crowds would close not only main street, but the sidewalks as well.

Up until last year a Victorian Ball could still be found every summer in Virgina City, prom's were still held at our local High Schools, and other dances and galas were held as for fundraisers. Hopefully we can return to these traditions and fill our streets once more with dancing and joyful celebration.

A number of talented Madison county youngsters have already been lined up and other acts are expected to be arranged for this week. Any person or group in the area who would like to lend their talents to supporting this Centennial observance is asked to contact any one of the three Sheridan ladies in charge.

The street dance will begin promptly at 9 p.m. on Sheridan's main street. Firemen have made arrangements to block off the main block. Extra lighting is being planned and bleachers from the high school will be set up for spectators. Bob Glick and Dave Hansen are in charge of the music with Oria Nottingham chairman of the kitty committee.

Responsible for making the street arrangements are James Moore, Harry Armstrong, Ben Hardin, Ken Halse, Lee Steiner and Howard Simonsen. Del Smith is in charge of publicity.






