



### KARL MILWARD MARLER CALDWELL AND FAMILY

Karl Caldwell was born in Vernal, Utah on February 16th, 1897. He was the son of George Washington Marler and Susan Caroline (Perry) Marler Caldwell; stepfather, Thomas Jefferson Caldwell. Married Mabel Ella Jolley Sept. 9, 1919, in St. George, UT. Karl grew up on a farm, then farming after school and acting as the local Deputy Sheriff. In June of 1948, Karl and his wife Mabel left Leeds, UT and moved to Sheridan, Montana. Making the move



with them was his adult son Kay, his first wife, Myrlean and their small daughter, Coreen, Monty

and Elbert (Al) Pack and their two sons, Jerry and John. Karl M. Caldwell would go on to become the Caretaker for the Sheridan Cemetery for many summers after moving to the area. He also started his own business near his home called Caldwell's Stone Burr Flour Mill.

I found a 1957 Madisonian news story, and I quote it here: "A new industry, that of flour milling, is getting under way

### here."

Karl Caldwell has constructed stone bur mill in a building near his home, a block off main street west of the former Farmers Union (now just past Andy's Service) building and is grinding flour and breakfast cereal from hard, dryland Montana wheat. He is now ready to go into commercial operations. Mr. Caldwell, who learned the miller's occupation as a young man in Utah, has been perfecting his hand-made mill for some time. He ground the first flour with it here last Christmas. However, a few malfunctions developed and he has been working to perfect it since. "If you liked grandmother's cooking, here is a chance to get some of her raw material," the miller said, adding that the product of the old stone bur mill has not been offered to the general public for a long time. There is only one other such mill in Montana that Mr. Caldwell knows of, that one in Lewistown. Mr. Caldwell has not chosen a brand name as vet for his product. He savs he is using all high protein wheat, most of which was raised on the Dillon

bench. Some wheat he has bought from the Townsend area." For many years Caldwell's Stone burr Flour Mill was of great service to the community. Karl and Mabel were family orientated and loved to have family members around them. They enjoyed telling stories of the "old davs".

They had 18 grandchildren and 35 great grandchildren. Mabel died in November of 1979 in Sheridan at the age of 77. Karl died in Butte at the age of 85 in March of 1982.

Karl W. Caldwell, Karl M. Caldwell's son, was born July 17, 1921, in Hurricane, Utah, and was known as Kay. After he graduated from

high school in St. George, Utah. He married Myrlean Holden March 12,1947. He and his wife Myrlean moved with his parents to Sheridan in 1948 along their daughter Grace. One more daughter, Jovce Janel, was born to Kay and Myrlean in 1952, at the Ruby Valley Hospital. Myrlean passed away in May of 1953. Kay served in the army as an Infantryman and Squad Leader before being wounded in Italy. He served in the Army as an Infantryman and Squad Leader in North Africa, Italy and France during World War II. He was a staff sergeant and received the Bronze Star. He was wounded in Italy and after recovering in the hospital in Rome he was put into the Military Police. While as an MP he had charge of the Guard Detail that watched General Ike Eisenhower three separate times during Ike's rest periods at Cannes, France. He was honorably discharged from the service and returned to Sheridan where he worked for Ben Redd Chevrolet in Dillon and in 1956 went to work for Preston Chevrolet in Sheridan.

Kay later married Grace Cox Fournier on June 17, 1972. He started his own body shop in Sheridan and drove a school bus for the Sheridan Schools for many years. He was also served as a Deputy Sheriff for 10 years and retired in 1987. He passed away in November of 1995.
