

WANNUSH



Her name was Wannush, but she was better known as Indian Mattie White Bear in Virgina City and surrounding areas.

In 1871 when she was about 20 and would have been seen as a muscular Bannock belle. She stood at 5 feet 5 inches tall and would have been dolled up in Indian fashion: hair nicely braided, wrapped in a gorgeous red blanket striped with green and yellow stripes, legs encased in red leggings and her feet would have been in beautiful beaded moccasins she made herself.

The Bannocks were the remnants of a once

powerful Shoshonean tribes as was Sacajawea of the Lewis and Clark expedition. This tribe at one time claimed the territory now embraced in the counties of Beaverhead, Madison and Gallatin and also parts of what is now Idaho to the south of Madison County.

Every summer in those days, there was one family that came and camped out near the old slaughterhouse grounds. Then, other families came, and at one time there were seven families that came on horseback, bringing their tepees and any other needs on pack horses. Mattie lived mainly in a camp near what was known as the Slaughterhouse, in the Willows along Daylight Creek on the branch that flowed from Gumpatch Hollow as the camp existed in the late 1870's. She would have lived there with a few others of her tribe every early spring to late fall. The water was good, wood was plentiful and food was ample because of the near by Slaughterhouse.

Mattie had a husband she referred to as "my man" Named Chief White Bear. She was an extremely hard worker and was known to pick gooseberries, apples and other local fruits grown in the area, selling them around town. She also rode or walked all over the Gulch to trade for chores and did the laundry for not only the miners but for the more prominent family's of Virginia City. Sometimes her wage was usually part of a compensation; she would show up in time for breakfast, staying on doing other chores until dinner.

In 1902, a Virginia City resident named Mary Isabella Foreman passed away at the age of 38. A touching scene was enacted at her funeral when Mattie, who for years had done housework for Mrs Foreman, asked for permission to see her. When her request was granted, Mattie stood by the casket with bowed head, sobbing, "Good woman! Good woman!" while the tears streamed down her cheeks. In 1907, the Lemhi/ Shoshone were again moved to Fort Hall when the Treaty of 1868 failed to be ratified. Mattie and her family was moved over to Fort Hall later on in her life. Mattie kept the original people's memory alive after they were placed in Salmon, Idaho by re-telling their history to the next generation of young indians and whomever was around to listen.

In my research I found that the early residents of Virginia City would tell their children to behave or Mattie would get them. I also found stories where she was very kind to the local children and was fondly remembered by many for her kindness.

As she grew older, Mattie made gloves and moccasins that became quite popular with the

The last summer of her life in 1932 she was accompanied by a woman and a young man who assisted Mattie, who was almost totally blind and feeble from old age, and found it difficult to get around and remained in camp most of the time until the party's departure. In 1933 a Mr. F. A. Gross, superintendent of the Fort Hall Agency at Fort Hall, Idaho, arrived in Virginia City and told the residents of the death of Wannush, the aged Indian woman who made her home here for many years.

In the late 1940s Chief White Bear came to town, said he was Indian Mattie's husband, and wanted to be taken up to the area where Mattie had camped so he could take part in helping at the slaughterhouse. The Sheriff named Brook had a hard time convincing him that the slaughterhouse had been torn down. Finally, they took him up to the empty spot where the slaughterhouse used to sit to show it was no longer there nor was it in operation. Chief White Bear ended up going back to the reservation to live out the rest of his life after finding out there was no work for him there.


