

ST. MARY'S HOSPITAL IN VIRGINIA CITY

With the discovery of gold in Alder Gulch (1863) the first rush of placer miners swelled the population of Virginia City to 20,000-mostly men, loud, rough, ambitious for gold and all it could buy. By 1865, Madison County was one of the original nine counties created by the first territorial legislature. On lower Idaho Street in Virginia city, a simple log structure was constructed in 1866 and served as the county courthouse during Virginia City's stint as territorial capital (1865-1875).

When the present courthouse on Wallace Street replaced it in 1876, Father Joseph Giorda, S.J., Missionary, hearing the mining camp's youthful roar, established All Saints
Church earlier in Virginia City. Not long after a second pastor, Father F. J. Kelleher, pleaded with the Sisters of Charity to open a hospital in this promising locality. A grueling journey by train and stagecoach brought three
Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth, Kansas, to Virginia City in 1876. The former Madison County Courthouse had been vacated. The sisters purchased the building, which then sat next to
All Saints' and converted it to St. Mary's Hospital for miners. The Hospital was prepared to receive patients at the following rates: County patients at \$10 per week. Private patients with extra room \$12 per week.


Sister Louisa Carney was the superior of this group staffing; Sister Mary Leo Dempsey was a nurse and Sister Irene McGrath, the novice, would train as a nurse under the older Sisters. The three mentioned above made the long trip from Leavenworth. The hospital prospered, providing a godsend to the miners who flocked to it, not so much for cure as for care. In that remodeled log courthouse, the sisters worked strenuously without benefit of any conveniences.
