JACKSUN'S HAHUHNS

Les "Bing" Jackson and his wife Betty could be said to have been "hobby gardeners," but this hardly covers the extent of their love for the art of cultivation, both of their garden, and their community. Both teachers at the Sheridan High School, and involved in countless other ways, many remember the positive impact the Jackson's had on the community.

The garden began in 1972 when they purchased the property from Glen Marsh with the intent of eventally someday building a home there. The house never materialized, but what they did build was one of the largest and most beloved flower gardens in Southwest Montana.

Originally just stone and sagebrush, the land had to be carefully developed to support the trees, shrubs, flowers, and vegetable patches. They hauled in thousands of tons of top soil and developed their own compost, resulting in the wonderfully rich soil the garden still has today. Their secret garden on Mill Creek was considered one of the treasures of the Sheridan community. Bing and Betty encouraged their friends and

community members to visit and enjoy the garden. Their passion was an inspiration for all. In 2002, Betty passed away, and in the next few years the garden became more and more difficult for Bing to manage by himself. Years later, friends came together to help him reclaim a bit of what had become a jungle of weeds and brush. More people began to joined the effort, and by 2008 the informal efforts of a few friends had returned the garden to much of its former glory.

In 2009 three friends from Sheridan: Linda Day, Janet Marsh, and Paulette Hardy, had an idea. They were avid gardeners and thought that a Sheridan Community Garden project would be "just up their alley." They approached Bing Jackson about the possibility of renting space in his garden to grow vegetables for the community. From this idea and the great generosity of Mr. Jackson the Jackson's Community Garden was born.

After incorporating as a nonprofit, Bing donated the property to the volunteers who had worked with him over the years to keep the garden growing.

Today, the Garden has become a beautiful result of community work and effort, and is a rare oasis for the public to enjoy. It has been greatly developed with the installation of a high tunnel greenhouse to extend the growing season, a nature trail for éducation and enjoyment of visitors, and an extensive drip irrigation system to facilitate low-water use irrigation. They have improved access and parking, and most recently, added bathroom facilities. Today, members and volunteers of the community come together to incorporate education, sustainable organic agriculture, community involvement, and enjoyment for everyone.



One of the first bridges built in Montana, and the last toll bridge to exist within the state, is no more. In its place, across the Big Hole river, near Brown's station, there have been erected two steel bridges at an approximate cost of \$9,000. Gorge R. Metlen, secretary of the state highway commission, was in Dillon last Friday to superintend the opening of the bridge to the general public.

In describing the new bridge, Mr. Metlen said that without question, it was absolutely one of the best and finest in the state, although there are eight others of similar nature in the process of construction. Steel, ordered last June, has only just begun to arrive, and the building of bridges in various other parts of the state is now being rushed to completion. The new bridge, said Mr. Metlen, is distinctively of a pioneer type, in as much as it embodies the latest engineering designs, and is built on the order of a railroad bridge. Every steel portion bEing firmly riveted to its neighbor to eliminate loose, hanging or sliding parts, making the structure especially adaptable to the bearing of heavy traffic, such as twenty ton thrashing outfits. The main bridge across the Big Hole river near Browne's station is 175 feet in length, while its smaller companion , spanning a slough near the main river, is built on exactly the same lines, but is only 50 feet in length. When the new bridge was thrown open to traffic yesterday, afters its inspection by Mr. Metlen. Joe Browne, son of the late Gen. Joseph A. Browne.

When the new bridge was thrown open to traffic yesterday, afters its inspection by Mr. Metlen, Joe Browne, son of the late Gen. Joseph A. Browne, who for years conducted the toll bridge, destroyed for the sake of the new, was the first man to drive a car across the newly-laid planks.

The old Browne's bridge was built in the early 1860's by a private company that secured permission through an act of congress to use it as a toll bridge. Soon after its erection it was purchased by Gen. Joseph A. Browne, who continued to use the bridge as a source of revenue until the late 1890's, when it was the last toll bridge in the state, but was still a portion of the main highway until condemned a few years ago.

With the construction of the new bridge, automobile traffic has been resumed between Beaverhead County and Butte. During the winter months it was necessary to suspend auto traffic between the mining city and this county on account of the depth of snow in the mountains in the vicinity of Melrose. The hills in that region have now been eliminated from the main road by the new bridge and two miles severed from the length of the journey.
