### HISTORICAL RUBY VALLEY CHRISTMAS ARTICLES

Christmas is one day of the American calendar that is made the principal holiday of the year, an occasion for mirth, music, feasting, innocent sports and general amusements, the old and young participating with equal zest and befitting enthusiasm. As the residents of Madison county are closing a year of material prosperity, it is assumed that they will make the holiday season a week of merriment and good cheer, featured by numerous public entertainments. (excerpts from the Madison County Monitor, 1916)

It was a large and gay crowd that attended the Christmas dance in White's hall on Christmas night. The dance, which was given under the auspices of Messrs. Dug. Gillis and Geo. Pritchett was a success—socially and financially. A palatable supper was served at the Stark hotel. The shoot given by Messrs. Dugald Gillis and George Pritchett on Christmas day was well attended by the nimrods (sic "skillful hunters") of Twin Bridges and vicinity. The "slaughter of the innocents" was great. Many turkeys, ducks, and chickens came to an untimely end from the effects of cold lead administered by the aforesaid nimrods. (Montana Centennial Melange, 1888).

Normal hall was filled to its utmost capacity with people from Twin Bridges and vicinity who assembled there to participate in the festivities in honor of the anniversary of the Savior. At 8:30 o'clock the curtains were drawn aside and a beautiful sight was presented to the audience. The stage was artistically decorated with an arch of evergreens beautifully decorated and suspending a bell. Two Christmas trees on either side of the stage were seen in all their glory of radiant candles. The exercises were opened by four little girls ringing the bell. After all the songs and performances by the children were through, Santa Claus and his wife appeared on the scene, plucked the good things from the Christmas trees and distributed them among the audience. (Montana Centennial Melange, 1888).

At the state orphans' home, the children will render a characteristically pleasing program, featured by a Christmas cantata, "Around the World with Santa Claus", and several selections by the boys' band. The dancing population of Twin Bridges and vicinity represents the registration list of the community, according to rough guess, hence the dance scheduled for Monday night at Paige's hall will be a big ballroom event. The music will have the rhythmic tingle. The midnight supper will be served at Mrs. Amarine's restaurant and will be some spread. (Madison County Monitor, 1916.)

At Estlin's theater, Santa Claus—the genial, bewhiskered, gruff, but kindly old fellow, fresh from Bear Gulch, was a visitor at the first Twin Bridges Community Christmas tree. He distributed 160 stockings (red, green, and white) filled with Christmas goodies to all the children. The children performed a Christmas program while waiting for Santa and it was deemed very successful due to the children who so kindly gave their time and talents to the Yule time celebration. (Twin Bridges Independent and Madison County Monitor, 1916).

Christmas gift suggestions from historical Ruby Valley stores. The Whiteman Drug Co. recommended books, white ivory toilet sets, embossed stationery, rings, pins, chain necklaces, brooches, folding Kodaks and Brownies, rifles, drums, candies, and perfumes. (Twin Bridges Independent, 1916). Handkerchiefs, ties, shirts, hats, caps, sox, and shoes were put forth by Joe Marshall Clothier, who boasted the "prices right on every article". (Twin Bridges Independent, 1916). The Twin Bridges Drug Co. suggested Victrolas, Victrola records, silverware, jewelry, hairbrushes, manicure sets, toys, handbags, clocks, Eastman Kodaks, albums, fine bulk and box candy, stationery, shaving sets, cut class, Persian ivory, flashlights, cigars, pipes, cigarette cases, smoking sets, and chinaware. "We have everything suitable for Xmas whether your purse be large or small". (Twin Bridges Independent, 1916). Victrolas (our special offer makes it possible for everyone to have music in their homes on Christmas day), bread and cake boxes, universal percolators, princess electric flat irons, baby electric flat irons, Clark's carriage heater, automatic screwdrivers and drills, hatchets, granite roasters, savory steel roasters, razor strops, pearl and stag-handle pocket knives, two-bladed knife with chain, ice skates, roller skates, wagons, framed pictures, (Twin Bridges Independent, 1918).


George Curtis played Santa Claus to the children of Twin Bridges and vicinity last Friday, distributing over 220 sacks of candy among the young hopefuls and by so doing has made a warm spot for himself in the hearts of all the young folks. Mr. Curtis also remembered his older customers during the holiday week with a Christmas cigar. (Twin Bridges Independent, December 1923)



Then too, the ever mounting cost of things that are of vital necessity, precludes the idea of lavish and over-costly articles that do not properly now have a fitting place in the affairs of everyday life. Liberty Bond subscriptions, Red Cross donations and the many avenues of expense are a patriotic drain on every purse; rightly so and yet we must ever hold in mind the fact that loved ones must be remembered. (Madison County Monitor, 1917).











### The Christmas Star



A Great Conjunction is when 2 or more celestial bodies are 2 degrees or less apart. Jupiter & Saturn are currently about 2 degrees apart. On the 21st of December, which is also Winter Solstice, they will be less than 0.1 degrees apart. This makes for a bright looking star and is, therefore, called the Christmas Star.

Jupiter and Saturn come close together about every 20 years, but to be less than 0.2 degrees apart is very rare. The last time they were this close was on July 6, 1623, but it was only 13 degrees from the Sun and unobservable. The last observable Great Conjunction this close was in 1226, in medieval times. The next great conjunction will be on November 2, 2080.

Finding and viewing the Great Conjunction on December 21, 2020, Winter Solstice (the shortest day of the year).

#### **SUNSET @4:42 PM**

CIVIL TWILIGHT @5:22 PM: This is when the brightest stars start to appear in the night sky. Jupiter and Saturn will be visible by this time.

NAUTICAL TWILIGHT @6 PM: All the stars are out. Jupiter & Saturn will appear at one star and will be located about 15 to 20 degrees above the horizon in the Southwest. It will be the brightest star-looking object in the sky. These planets will set around 7 PM.

Note: on the 16th of December look to the Southwest for a 2-day old very slim Crescent Moon, Jupiter and Saturn will be just above it. They should be visible at about 5:01 PM.


