The following drama was played at Twin Bridges the past week and explains itself. Road it and son.

ACT I. (Scene--Twin Bridge hotel. Dining room.)

Angry man with large wooden paddle A little girl. Man using club with a will. Child crying for morey.

ACT.II. (Scone-C. P. Newell's court room) Enter-Prisoner, smiling, accompanied by friend, (a woman). Entor ... Five witnesses and the county attorney. Judge pronbunces sentonce-\$15. After some delay it is paid.

ACT III. (Scone -C. P. Newoll's court room one day later.) Enter -Mrs. Moore on the arm of L. R. Medars, also two witnessos. A marriago is performed. (Scone II, Monitor office) Papers being drawn up for the arrest of happy couple. (Scene III, Rai's road depot.) Constable serving papers on happy couple. (Scone IV. Same as III.) They sottle and leave, Good riddanco.

To give a detailed account of the above dramn we will say that L. R. Medars was arrested last Saturday for whipping the 4-year-old girl (Act 1) of Mrs. Moore at whose home ho was a (pretended) boarder. The mother of the httle child had given him the right to whip the children he said and this was found to be true but the citizens of our town did not care to see the little ones killed and there'ere took a hand in the matter. He waived a jury trial and made his own dofense. After all witnesses were examined Judge Newell found him guilty and fined him \$15, the fine being paid by Mrs. Moore. Next day they appeared before Judge Newell again (Act 11) and asked him to carry on his good work. He complied and though it was his first experience he wont through the marringe ceremony with all the necessary flourishes. While the two were being married papers were being drawn up in the printing office to hold the goods of the two who were about to make an extended wedding trip but forget to pay their bills. Scono III shows the constable serving the papers on the station agent and Scene IV closes with the two making a settlement.

RUBY VALLEY ENTERTAINMENT

When springtime rolls around, I am always reminded of live theater. As a student at Sheridan High School, we performed in plays each spring. Live productions have always been of source of entertainment for the Ruby Valley community.

There were amateur drama clubs in most towns. The most prevalent companies in the early days were the Twin Bridges, Sheridan, and Pony Drama Clubs. James Gordon Walker of Virginia City started a troupe there in 1901. These organizations traveled throughout the region, performing in various towns as well as their own. National renowned travelling drama groups also graced the local stages. Plays were often performed for fundraisers of various buildings and other causes.

In the late 1890s a Theater was built on Main Street in Sheridan. Marguerite Ann Miller Black recalled from her childhood, "The new hall was built on Main Street. Local talent staged real, live drama such as 'The Face on the Barroom Floor' There we also had our first silent movies with solos between the changing of the reels."

Twin Bridges performances were held in White's and Paige's halls until 1914, when Estlin's Opera House was built. Al Ellis constructed a rock-faced steel, nearly fireproof building with all the fixings and furnishings of the most complete theater in the state. It seated 150 people and hosted live and moving theater productions, as well as large balls and dances.

In July of 1948, Charles Bovey booked a college dramatic club for a miner's convention in the "Old Stone Barn", and the famous annual Virginia City Players exposition was born. To this day, it is the oldest continually running summer stock theater company in the Northwest. Now called "The Opera House", the building is an exact replica of a 19th century theater. Shows are performed by professional acting troupes from all over the country. Tickets for the 2021 season go on sale in April, carrying on the legacy of the Valley's admiration of dramatic productions.
