



TWIN BRIDGES MUSEUM - TWIN BRIDGES HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION

Carefully stowed in the corners

the Twin Bridges Museum are many historical artifacts including Indian artifacts, photos, a doll house and vintage dolls, homesteading papers, details about the Children's Center, agricultural records, tools, books and so much more. The Twin Bridges Historical Association was created in October of 1996 with a mission in mind as a on-profit to preserve our past for the future. It started with Joy Day, Ed Rupple, Linda Maddox, Ken Walsh, Verta Dorseth, Jerry Nyhart, Norman Frankland, Mark Pederson, Richard Marshall and Sheila Burke.



With this dream the Reid building, one of the earliest

commercial structures built in Twin Bridges was purchased in 1997. The Reid Building was perfect for the location of the Museum. It is located in the very center of Twin Bridges, on the tourist route through the Jefferson and Ruby Valleys, from Interstate 90 to the gold towns of Nevada and Virginia City and over to West Yellowstone.

Volunteers worked to conserve, restore, and arrange the displays relating to the history of the Ruby Valley. It was a dream of these long time community members to have a museum that housed Ruby Valley and the surrounding area memorabilia. The building is a showcase of the history of the indigenous culture, early pioneers and all aspects of mining and agriculture. The Twin Bridges Historical Association goal is to protect the integrity of our local communities way of life.

Twin Bridges is on the Lewis and Clark Trail. Captains Lewis and Clark, Touissaint Charboneau, Patrick Gass, George Drewyer and Sacajawea camped on the east bank of the Beaverhead River, four blocks northwest of where the Reid Building sits today. It took thousands of volunteer hours and a huge amount of fund raising for donations to renovate the 1917 building to bring it up to code. Some of the early work was to replace the roof and rewire the structure and meet handicap access.

The Ruby Valley is steeped in history. It was a central gathering place for many Indian Tribes. For more than a 100 years the Ruby Valley was a stop for miners, loggers, farmers and ranchers. Today, Twin Bridges is known for blue ribbon fly-fishing, tourism, farming and ranching. Twin Bridges is also home to the Madison County Fair and companies like the R.L. Winston Rod Company.

In 1999 the Association received income of \$24,289.06 from donations and help from the annual fund raising event, Floating Flotilla and Fish Fantasies, by selling ducks for an aquatic parade on the Beaverhead River. This income as well as donations help to pay for regular maintenance of utilities and of the structure as well as for the monthly fees for the security system.

The doors first opened for the public in June of 1999 showcasing items generously donated which helped to keep the museum free of charge. To this day the collection continues to grow creating an historic archive for all to learn from.

The volunteers keep it open from Monday through Saturday. Hours are 1:00pm-5:00pm, from Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend. Located on 202 Main Street just off of Highway 287 in Twin Bridges, MT. Once you walk through the doors, find that it is possible for history to come back to life.
