## LOCAL MERCHANT JOHN F. FOX

John F. Fox was born in New York City on October 7, 1860. He began his education in New York City and he finished grammar and high school in Milwaukee, WI. His father, Peter Fox, was born in New York City in 1823, and was in the clothing business in New York for some years and afterward became a clothing merchant in Milwaukee, WI. Peter would become the teacher, adviser and employer for John. At the age of fifteen, John went to work in a Milwaukee store for \$1.50 a week. For ten years altogether he worked in various mercantile establishments in Milwaukee and Detroit, Michigan. In the 1880's he came out to Montana with his brother, William Fox. They first opened stores in Phillipsburg, Granite, and Butte. In May of 1895, they established the Fox Brothers store in Sheridan just one door east of the Ruby Hotel. John went back to Detroit in 1888 where he met and married Miss Katherine Wolfschlager, a native of that city. In 1899 established his home in Twin Bridges and opened a dry goods and clothing store called Fox's Department Store, which later became the Campbell



Garage, located on Main Street. John and Katherine had one daughter named Edna



In August of 1911, William Fox sued his brother John for opening the same type of store in Twin Bridges they had opened in Sheridan. William felt their partnership had been violated. This case was not settled until July of 1915. They both agreed to disagree and ended up paying their own cost for legal fees.

Besides the cares and responsibilities entailed by this business, Mr. Fox was active in promoting mining and farming interests. He was the first president of the Farmers Elevator Company of Twin Bridges and held that position for several years. He, along with the local farmers were instrumental in establishing the elevator as a means of better marketing facilities in this part of Madison County. John Fox was also the director of the First National Bank of Twin Bridges.

If you were to go back in time and catch a glimpse of John's life you would see that in the evenings, the Lotts or the Comforts or the Hathaways would join them on their front porch fighting off the famous Ruby Valley mosquitoes and conversing about the latest cattle or wheat

prices. Edna's friends would come over to visit and there would be endless giggling, fudge parties, and fun outdoor picnics and fishing along the banks of the Ruby or Beaverhead rivers. Their neighbor, Mr. Pollinger, had a splendid green parrot who would sit on the back fence and shout out advice on gardening. John loved to take trips to shop for the newest cars available in Butte. He would become one of the first automobile owners in Twin Bridges.

John, along with his wife and child, would go for summer family visits to Milwaukee, WI. While there, John would find and bring back new products and supplies to his Fox department store in Twin Bridges. From his huge sample books, he would have offered much of the material to the local ladies for their many quilts and sewing projects. They would also travel to California until 1941 when

WW2 broke out.

His daughter, Edna, graduated from the University of Montana in 1910. She and Washington Jay McCormick from Missoula were married at the Fox home in Twin Bridges on September 21, 1915. Jay was a lawyer and served in the legislature and was elected to Congress in 1919.

In January of 1926, John sold all his store inventory and auctioned off the building. A farewell message was printed in the April 1926 Madisonian that stated "Mr. and Mrs. Fox will be missed in this community, where they have lived so many years taking an active interest in the business and social affairs of the town. They have the best wishes of their friends for the future of their welfare." John retired in 1926 after thirty-one years in Madison County and moved to Missoula. John Fox passed away there on July 4, 1947 at the age of 86.






